Stabbed in the Back

Doug Ford and the Provincial government stabbed us in the back with Bill 66 – legislation designed to hurt our union (and others) and our collective bargaining agreements. (see KillBill66.com) . They are also working to get rid of the College of Trades (OCOT) and move the apprenticeship program to a Skill Sets system which will weaken the trade. These direct attacks are something we would never vote for or support, so, brothers and sisters let's not make the same mistake during this Federal Election.

Loyalty

Right now, the Federal Liberals have shown loyalty to our union and to our jobs. Quite simply, Federal Liberal policies coincide with protecting the unions' hardfought rights. Liberal policies are good for our jobs and our worker's rights and agreements.
